Annual Gift to OHSU

SHOC presented an \$80,000 check to Dr. Tanja Pejovic, Division Chief of

Gynecologic Oncology at the OHSU Knight Cancer Institute, on Thursday, November 3rd. This 7th Annual donation pushed the Foundation over \$380,000 in total contributions to Gynecologic Cancer research at OHSU! Such funds have helped the lab to identify new proteins linked to aggressive Ovarian Cancer, understand the mutational status of DNA repair genes for non BRCA1 and BRCA2 Ovarian Cancer, and expand its resources gained through the Oregon Ovarian Cancer Registry (OOCR) by joining forces with the Ovarian Cancer Association Consortium (OCAC)—the largest international association focused on identifying genetic forms of Ovarian Cancer and new treatments.

Honoring Heidi Moore Angell
